Key Vocabulary

primary source	Original documents or materials created during a period in history that provide first-hand evidence of that time.
secondary source	Documents or materials created later by someone who did not experience first-hand that period in history.
chronological	The arrangement of events or dates in the order that they happened.
locality	A place and its surroundings.
borough	A district within a large town, which has its own council.
era	A period of time in history defined by cultural or historical factors.
architecture	The design and construction of buildings.
residential	Buildings designed for people to live in.
population	All the inhabitants of a particular place.
census	An official survey that counts the population.
migration	The movement of people from one country, locality or place of residence to another.
agriculture	Farming: cultivating land for crops and livestock.
diverse	Showing variety across a range.

Key Knowledge

Ealing derives its name from Gillingas, which means the people of Gilla.
Gilla may have been an Anglo-Saxon settler.

Over the centuries, its name has changed. Ealing has been known as Yealing, Zelling and Eling until Ealing became the standard spelling in the nineteenth century.

During the Victorian era Ealing became a town: roads were built; drainage provided; and schools and public buildings erected.

The Great Western Railway - built in the 1830s - passed through Ealing. Ealing Broadway railway station was opened in 1838.

1901 was a great year for Ealing:

- Ealing officially became a borough
- Walpole Park was opened
- the first electric trams ran on the Uxbridge Road.

Ealing Broadway Shopping Centre was opened by Her Majesty the Queen on 7th March 1985.

The population of Ealing in 1598 was 428. It is now 347,796.



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
