Subject Specific Vocabulary	
cliff	A steep rock face usually at the edge of the sea.
coast	The area where the sea and land meet is called a coast.
harbour	A harbor is a section along the coastline where the ship and other water vessels are parked or stored.
sea	A large body of water surrounded by land.
beach	A pebbly or sandy shore, between the sea and a higher land place.
port	A port connects land with boats on the water. Boats load and unload different things here.
Physical feature	A feature that has been formed by nature.
Human feature	A feature that has been made or changed by humans.
resort	A popular place for holidays.
island	A piece of land completely surrounded by sea.
