


trade	The buying and selling of goods and services we want and need.	1. The UK is a more <u>developed</u> country and exports valuable <u>manufactured goods</u> . The United Kingdom's top trading partner is the United States.	
globalisation	The process of world's countries becoming connected as a result of international trade and cultural exchange.	2. The physical geography of a country determines what it can produce and what it can <u>export</u> . The United Kingdom's largest exports include machinery, vehicles and medicine.	
import	Bringing goods into a country for sale.	3. The human geography of a country determines what the highest-value export is.	
export	Sending goods to another country for sale.	4.
